

Snow Plow Ordinances

Be aware of snow removal ordinances effective November 1 - March 15.

Follow these practices to help keep citizens and snowplow drivers safe this winter.

 Do not blow or shovel snow onto the streets. It is against the law due



- Move vehicles off of the street during snowstorms to avoid blocking snowplows.
 November 1 March 15, please keep vehicles off the street to help eliminate accidental damage from other cars that may lose control on slick roads. (Ordinance 10-5-21A)
- Keep a safe distance between vehicles and the snowplow while driving. For the safety
 of snowplow drivers and all citizens on the road, maintain extra space
 between yourself, other cars, and snowplows.
- Clear snow around fire hydrants. (International Fire Code Section 508.5.5) Fire hydrants in front of homes must be clear of snow at all times to remain accessible to the fire department. Residents unable to get hydrants cleared can call the city for assistance.

Emergency Preparedness: Winter Storms
