This home has an obscured main entrance and is one of the best examples of Prairie style architecture existing in Ogden.



# Answer

2540 Eccles Ave

E. O. Wattis Home

Built in 1914

*Sarah Langsdon's and Tony Pantone's favorite home  
in Ogden.*

Built by a tailor, this home, while modest in scale, represents an interesting variation on the Queen Anne style with its dominating turret located above the small porch.

821 28th Street

Louis J. Holther House

Built in 1890





---

Built in 1908 by a prominent businessman and designed by the Ogden firm of Smith and Hodgson, this house has a front and side porch with brick rails capped in sandstone.

2604 Jefferson Ave.

Pingree Mansion

Built in 1908

*Sue Wilkerson's Favorite home in Ogden.*





This house, built in 1889, reflects the builders New England origin and is comprised of a two-story front section and a one-story extension at the rear with hickory wood siding.

2455 Van Buren Ave.

John C. and Ellen Prout House

Built in 1889





This home emphasizes functionality and simplicity with its boxed massing, long front porch, and gambrel roof.

675 25th Street

Abbot Rodney Heywood House

Built in 1902





This home has been described as one of the most sensitive designs in Ogden, with its rounded arches, tapered brick chimneys and canopied entrance.

Patrick & Mary Healy Home

Built in 1920

This two-story residence is based on a modified four-square floor plan with neo-classical features.

Lars & Caroline Hansen Home

Built in 1916





This building has many outstanding architectural features such as the turrets and the large wrap around porch.

John M. Browning House

Built in 1900

This house served as a convent from 1948 through 1967 and has a unique combination of elements from the Second Empire, Moorish, and Romanesque Revival Styles.

Dennis A. Smyth House

Built in 1889





This large Georgian Revival mansion used Greek and Roman building forms to emphasize solidarity and dignity.

Ralph Bristol House

Built in 1912

This home is the purest example of second empire architecture in Ogden City with its bell cast mansard roof covered in fish scale cedar shingles.
