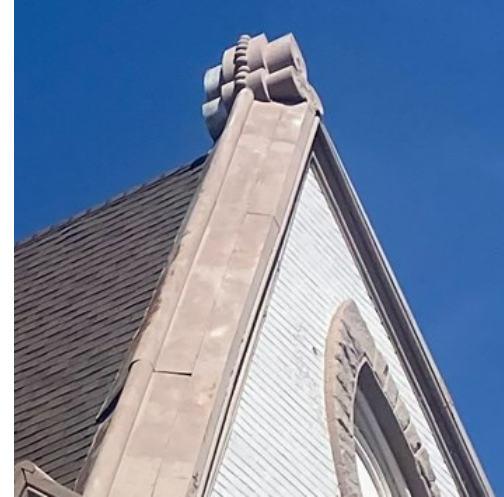
2. This three-story, masonry building was one of the few hotels that black Americans could stay due to segregation and the lack of equal housing at the time. During World War II, one of the rooms was used as an office for the black soldiers in the military police.

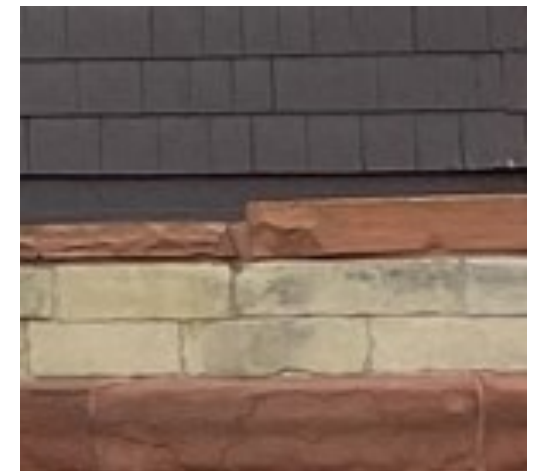

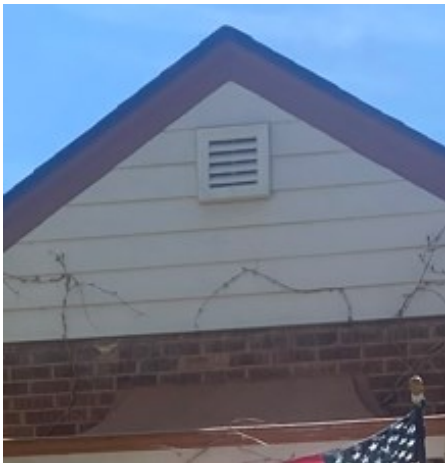
8. The front porch of this two and one-half story home was made into living space at the beginning of WWII when the home was converted to apartments to help with the housing shortage of that time.

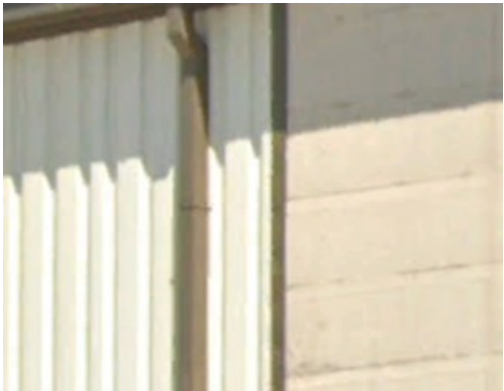

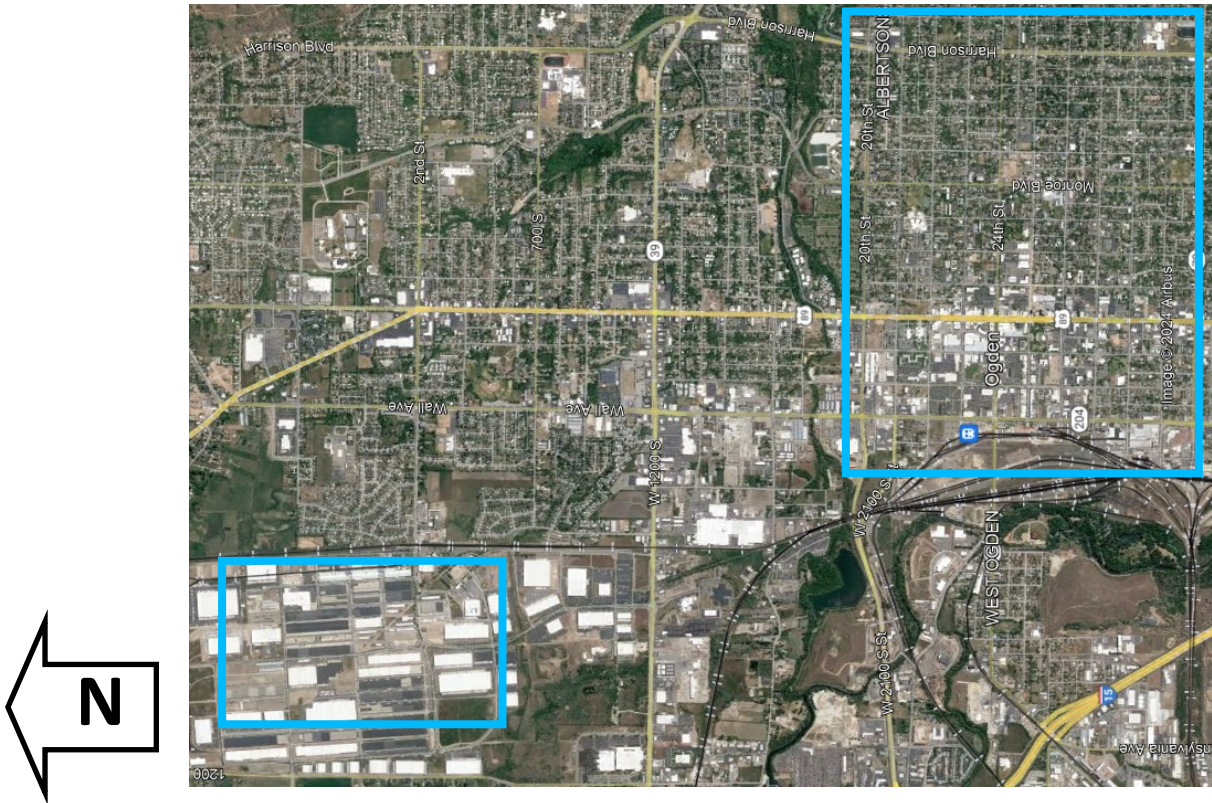
