You've had a you've had a lot of journey.

I have had a lot of journeys.

I've lived many places.  
But I started here in Ogden.

I moved here, at  
a very at a kindergarten age.

My father was in the military, and,

so he, he met when he met my mom,  
he took her away,

and we were, born in Louisiana  
and then came back to Utah.

And then I went to Pingree Elementary.

I went to watch Washington Junior High,  
and then I went to Ogden High.

And then I got married.

Right, before graduation.

0:03:03.333,0:03:04.583  
And then I moved away.

0:03:04.583,0:03:09.250  
I got married young, and,  
we had a son, and, we did that.

And then I came back,  
and I raised Marcus in the Ogden area.

So the Marshall White,

0:03:15.250,0:03:18.250  
That was our place to go.

We back in the day, we weren't allowed  
to live above Washington Boulevard.

So all of the blacks  
live below Washington Boulevard.

0:03:25.291,0:03:26.541  
So we had a nice,

0:03:28.375,0:03:29.083  
just a

0:03:29.083,0:03:33.041  
nice community, a community of just that's  
all we have was each other at that time.

And so,

0:03:35.041,0:03:37.458  
we, I raised Marcus.

When Marcus got to high school,

it was time for him  
to go to be with his father.

And then I decided to move away  
to the Washington, D.C.

area for 30 plus years.

And that was an experience for me.

that I am today.

that looked like myself and doing things

that I love to do and get some education  
and just build myself up.

So I did that, and so I wanted to,

0:04:18.916,0:04:21.208  
the kids  
of Utah have always been on my mind.

I would always hear about the statistics  
of the, suicide rates in our state.

And I said, oh my God, our children  
and I would come here every year

0:04:29.291,0:04:30.708  
for 30 years on vacation.

0:04:30.708,0:04:35.125  
I would see what's going on in,  
in the area and the moving and shaking.

It wasn't to my liking very much,  
but I was wondering what was going on

0:04:39.125,0:04:40.375  
with our children.

0:04:40.375,0:04:44.666  
So finally  
I decided to come back to semi retire

0:04:45.208,0:04:48.208  
and I started being a substitute teacher.

0:04:48.375,0:04:51.208  
And because I wanted to start  
and see what's going on with the kids,

0:04:51.208,0:04:52.791  
what are they talking about?  
What are they doing?

Why are they sad? What's going on?

0:04:54.958,0:04:57.958  
So I connected with the kids and,  
we loved one another.

I had a great time.

I did it for a couple of years,

and then I, decided to get out  
and work a little bit, and,

from there, I joined,

the NAACP for a short

0:05:11.291,0:05:14.666  
period of time,  
but our values didn't match one another.

But I enjoyed that, that experience.

And then from there,

I went up to Ben Lomond.

Yes, you did.

And that's where

0:05:25.875,0:05:27.500  
- That's where we're going to head.  
- Yes.

0:05:27.500,0:05:27.791  
Okay.

0:05:27.791,0:05:31.166  
We got some significant  
plans in the works, right?

Yes we do.

0:05:32.458,0:05:32.750  
Okay.

0:05:32.750,0:05:37.083  
So you're a you're a, a child  
with, a parent with the military service.

I hear that a lot from people that they,  
they spent some time in Ogden.

I actually hear it from the leadership  
in the command, leaders on base.

That a lot of their service members  
love to live in Ogden

0:05:46.666,0:05:48.541  
because they come from all over the world,

0:05:48.541,0:05:52.166  
but they feel more at home in Ogden  
than anywhere else in this area.

And so we yeah, we house and,

0:05:55.458,0:05:59.208  
and support a lot of service members  
in the city for that exact reason.

And you were one of them.

0:05:59.916,0:06:03.958  
And it's often that they come back  
after they retire or after

0:06:03.958,0:06:07.791  
or after they're, you know, growing  
and working on their own.

They come back to here  
and start a life on their own,

0:06:09.291,0:06:12.083  
because this is the one place in their  
service duty that they love the most.

Yes, absolutely.

0:06:13.375,0:06:16.041  
But I wanted to talk about Marcus.  
You mentioned Marcus.

0:06:16.041,0:06:18.500  
And he's the one that actually  
introduced me to you.

0:06:18.500,0:06:21.333  
And I, I met Marcus  
because of the Marshall White Center

0:06:21.333,0:06:24.750  
and the project and all the hubbub  
and the blow up around that.

0:06:25.125,0:06:27.500  
He was adamant the first time I ever met.

0:06:27.500,0:06:29.000  
And I was talking to him on the phone,

0:06:29.000,0:06:31.583  
and he was adamant that that Marshall  
White center stay put right.

0:06:31.583,0:06:32.000  
Where it was.

0:06:32.000,0:06:33.708  
Yes. Right. Yes.

0:06:33.708,0:06:35.000  
And why was that significant?

0:06:35.000,0:06:37.791  
It was significant  
because that's all we had.

0:06:37.791,0:06:40.500  
I mean, that is a place where we all went.

0:06:40.500,0:06:44.583  
I mean, the blacks, Hispanics, the whites,  
we all came together.

0:06:44.583,0:06:47.708  
There was a lot boxing championships  
there.

0:06:48.083,0:06:51.208  
There was concerts  
there, there was swimming there.

There was they would serve lunches  
for the kids during the summertime

0:06:55.375,0:06:58.833  
and then bussed them  
to, Upward Bound over at Weber State.

I mean, it was a significant,

0:07:02.750,0:07:06.708  
part of, of our history here in Ogden.

0:07:06.708,0:07:09.708  
And when we found out  
that it was going to be moved,

0:07:10.500,0:07:12.708  
it was it was heartbreaking for us.

0:07:12.708,0:07:15.833  
And that's when Marcus jumped in and said,  
mom, we've got to do something right,

0:07:15.875,0:07:18.500  
you know?  
And so that's how it's all to off.

0:07:18.500,0:07:19.750  
And that's why Marcus called me.

0:07:19.750,0:07:21.208  
And funny thing is, I was on my way

0:07:21.208,0:07:23.291  
to a city council meeting  
where we were going to talk about it.

0:07:23.291,0:07:26.291  
Marcus called and,

0:07:26.833,0:07:30.416  
and I knew before I even met him  
in person, talking to him on that phone,

0:07:31.041,0:07:34.208  
I remember turning left on to 26th  
and Washington and coming into the meeting,

0:07:34.875,0:07:38.000  
and I was just, like,  
so amped up talking to him

0:07:38.541,0:07:39.958  
like I had never met in person yet.

0:07:39.958,0:07:43.791  
And I knew in that that moment,  
he was like a brother to me in

0:07:43.791,0:07:45.208  
some way or some form.

0:07:46.250,0:07:47.125  
Just that energy.

0:07:47.125,0:07:50.250  
You can you can feel it through a phone,  
right? Yes.

0:07:51.250,0:07:54.250  
And he really inspired me to,

0:07:55.041,0:07:58.041  
for for me to look at things differently.

0:07:58.291,0:08:03.000  
And, if not for Marcus,

I wouldn't have gone home later that day.

0:08:03.000,0:08:06.000

And I told my wife, I said,

0:08:06.000,0:08:09.000

I think politics is over for me.

0:08:09.958,0:08:12.541

And I'm going to I'm  
going to lose a lot of, a lot of,

0:08:12.541,0:08:15.416

support and friendship over this,  
but I'm going to be

0:08:15.416,0:08:18.416

on the right side of history,  
and then we're going to set sail.

0:08:19.416,0:08:21.875

I guess I was wrong on some of that,

0:08:21.875,0:08:24.666

but I think we got it right

0:08:24.666,0:08:28.208

on the most important part of that,  
which was we kept it where it was. Yes.

0:08:28.375,0:08:31.125

And that was an a huge driver  
for that neighborhood.

0:08:31.125,0:08:32.875

Right. And that's the neighborhood  
you live in now?

0:08:32.875,0:08:35.750

Oh yes. I'm right there. I'm a homeowner.

0:08:35.750,0:08:39.541

I live in the house that my husband's,  
mother raised six kids there.

0:08:40.000,0:08:42.500

He lost his father at a young age,  
and they were living in West Ogden.

0:08:42.500,0:08:45.750

So West Ogden was was mostly black as well.

0:08:46.083,0:08:51.125

And so, when we when I got back from DC,  
we decided

0:08:51.125,0:08:54.625

that we were going to buy - because I didn't  
want to buy it , it???'s 117 years old.

0:08:54.625,0:08:57.333

And I was like, I don't want to,  
but I was raised in that area.

0:08:57.333,0:09:00.583

I was raised on Pingree  
Avenue, Wall Avenue, and,

0:09:01.250,0:09:05.250

and then Lincoln Avenue was our,  
I mean, that was the territory.

0:09:05.250,0:09:06.958

I said, you know what?

0:09:06.958,0:09:08.708

I'm going to stay right here.

0:09:08.708,0:09:10.250

This is where I'm from.

0:09:10.250,0:09:12.833

This is where I'm going to be.

That's right. Myself.

0:09:12.833,0:09:14.041

And we're going to figure this out.

0:09:14.041,0:09:16.000

We go. And we do it. Right.

0:09:16.000,0:09:18.458

- And we're doing with some attitude and.

- With some attitude.

Oh, yeah.

So I've never known you not to attitude.

been coppering ???tude since the day I met.

I know.

Same with Marcus. Right?

- Oh yes.

- But the beautiful thing is that that's that's the

0:09:30.000,0:09:33.583

neighborhood you raised Marcus in.

Marshall White Center's where you raised Marcus.

0:09:33.583,0:09:34.625

Right?

0:09:34.625,0:09:36.250

Marcus learned some hard lessons in life.

He had some hard knocks, but absolutely.

0:09:38.250,0:09:41.250

But he tells me, if not for the Marshall  
White Center, he's not who he is either.

And and he just recently moved back  
to Ogden.

Yes, he did.

0:09:44.833,0:09:47.333

And he's built himself into who he is  
today.

0:09:47.333,0:09:49.041

And he's he's an innovator

0:09:49.041,0:09:52.958

and a he's got a science  
background, is inventing and innovating.

Yes.

0:09:53.916,0:09:56.541

- He's really focused on kids as well.

- Yes.

0:09:56.541,0:09:59.416

In the vein of your legacy,  
in your example.

He cares deeply.

0:10:01.250,0:10:06.500  
And that's that's the story of resilience  
and that's the Ogden story.

- It is.  
- It's also the Ogden way.

It is the Ogden way.

0:10:09.625,0:10:11.750  
So when you were  
when you were growing up there,

certainly were relying on each other.

0:10:15.750,0:10:18.166  
- Right?  
- Yes.  
- Because we were a community.

0:10:18.166,0:10:21.166  
But you have talked to me a lot about

0:10:21.833,0:10:24.000  
over the years  
since we've gotten to know each other

0:10:24.000,0:10:26.750  
about relying on yourself

0:10:26.750,0:10:29.750  
- and the accountability for self first.  
- Yes.

0:10:29.958,0:10:32.958  
Tell me about  
tell me about that in your story and,

0:10:33.291,0:10:36.166  
and in the story of raising Marcus.

0:10:36.166,0:10:39.416  
It was,  
it was tough raising Marcus here in,

0:10:39.958,0:10:42.541  
we started in Ogden  
and then we, we sort of moved

0:10:42.541,0:10:45.541  
to Salt Lake before he went to California  
to be with his father.

0:10:45.625,0:10:48.958  
But it was always a struggle,  
raising him by myself.

0:10:48.958,0:10:52.333  
But I got out there  
and I started working here very young.

0:10:52.333,0:10:55.333  
My first job was a dispatcher  
for the Weber County Police.

0:10:55.416,0:10:57.166  
I mean, sheriff's department, right.

0:10:57.166,0:10:59.333

And so I've always worked and tried to,

0:11:00.875,0:11:02.666  
to, to raise him and but I

0:11:02.666,0:11:05.666  
did the best I could,  
and he never lacked anything.

0:11:06.500,0:11:10.375  
And so that's  
what really the strength in me

0:11:10.375,0:11:13.791  
came out when I knew that  
I had to do the best I could with him.

0:11:14.041,0:11:16.208  
He was such a loving young man to  
at the time.

0:11:16.208,0:11:17.875  
It was very easy for me,

0:11:17.875,0:11:21.125  
but it taught me a lesson and taught me  
how to be a wonderful mother,

0:11:21.250,0:11:24.958  
a strong mother, and to make sure  
that I supported him in his sports.

0:11:24.958,0:11:28.500  
And I made a way to be there for him  
when we moved to Salt Lake.

0:11:28.500,0:11:31.708  
But it was always a struggle,  
but it made me strong.

The rent here was always high, for us,

0:11:35.500,0:11:40.416  
so we always struggled, with the rent  
was always higher than what we got paid.

And so I was like, oh, but we did it,  
you know, and and,

0:11:44.875,0:11:47.541  
he did very well in school,  
but it was time for us to part ways

0:11:47.541,0:11:51.458  
- so he can be a man from a boy to a man  
- It???'s a big step.

0:11:51.500,0:11:55.791  
Yes, it's a big step because I knew that  
he needed his father at that time.

0:11:56.208,0:11:58.500  
And so that's when we decided to,

0:11:59.875,0:12:02.708  
do that, let him go and finish  
high school in California.

And then that's  
when I decided I'm going to.

0:12:05.541,0:12:06.416  
I worked here for a while,

0:12:06.416,0:12:10.666

then I decided I got a job,  
transferred to go to the DC area,

0:12:10.916,0:12:14.125  
and that's when I started a bigger career,  
for myself.

So. Okay, so as you're raising Marcus.

Obviously you had a lot of investment  
in yourself and in him.

It must have been times  
where you felt alone or lonely, but,

but there were also,  
it sounds like a lot of times

where you knew you weren't alone, that  
you were surrounded love and caring

- And community  
- The community.

Listen, I, I,  
I have nothing negative to say

0:12:37.666,0:12:40.666  
about Ogden, about Utah, period.

0:12:41.000,0:12:43.583  
Every say,  
every experience that I've had here

0:12:43.583,0:12:47.541  
was always positive  
and enlightening for me.

0:12:47.541,0:12:49.125  
We always came together.

0:12:49.125,0:12:53.333  
I did not feel that  
I was being discriminated against,

0:12:54.541,0:12:55.375  
or or

0:12:55.375,0:12:59.750  
any type of things that I hear people  
talk about in other cities and states.

I don't feel that here in Ogden  
now we've got our issues here.

living in this state.

we started our talk.

of your mindset

Principal Paul at the time,

he was telling me that, well,

0:16:11.708,0:16:14.625  
that he would like to have something

0:16:14.625,0:16:18.041  
for the our black kids to be a part of.

0:16:18.250,0:16:20.791  
So he said, what do you think about

0:16:22.000,0:16:23.333  
you, you know,

0:16:23.333,0:16:27.583  
being a part of us and  
and having we're going to have a class.

0:16:27.916,0:16:30.041  
And I'd love for you  
to participate in the class.

0:16:30.041,0:16:31.958  
And I was like, this is awesome.

0:16:31.958,0:16:34.958  
So I started working with the kids and,

0:16:36.500,0:16:37.583  
wonderful kids.

0:16:37.583,0:16:42.208  
I had 13 at first, 13 kids and.

0:16:44.250,0:16:45.166  
I want to tell this story.

0:16:45.166,0:16:45.833  
I have to tell this.

0:16:45.833,0:16:48.333  
- You have to.  
- I have to be honest. Okay.

0:16:48.333,0:16:51.875  
So we were invited up to Weber  
State, and Weber State was having,

0:16:54.000,0:16:57.416  
something to do with justice or something

0:16:57.416,0:16:59.000  
they invited us about.

0:16:59.000,0:17:03.708  
So when we got there, our kids,  
it was about how many?

0:17:03.708,0:17:06.708  
How many of you kids know  
anybody's been killed by police

0:17:06.916,0:17:08.208  
and all this type of stuff?

0:17:08.208,0:17:11.750  
So they were talking about things  
that they were dealing with that the,

0:17:11.958,0:17:14.208  
black students  
I guess, we're dealing with in their lives

0:17:14.208,0:17:16.500  
because, you know, people from all over  
come to Weber State.

0:17:16.500,0:17:19.875  
So the kids was looking like we don't know  
anybody that's, you know,

0:17:19.916,0:17:21.208  
they are not about that.

0:17:21.208,0:17:23.458  
They haven't been exposed.

0:17:23.458,0:17:26.375  
Are you kids haven't been exposed to

0:17:26.375,0:17:29.375  
some of the things like kids  
from other states have.

0:17:29.625,0:17:31.791  
So they were standing around lost.

0:17:31.791,0:17:33.916  
Well, let me tell you after.

0:17:33.916,0:17:37.000  
And then so when we went down to eat  
and then some of the kids

don't come here to Weber State,  
this is awful.

state, I was like -

oh my God, I just teared up.

I said, something has happened.

The principal called and he said  
they didn't enjoy that

event

They they couldn't relate to it and  
they thought it was something different.

And so did, Delores.  
I was like, well, it wasn't my fault.

I didn't know what to expect either.

So anyway, so two months went by,  
my heart was broken, two months went by,

and, the principal called me and he said,  
Delores, the kids want you to come back

and they want you to help them go

on a historic black college tour.

0:18:34.916,0:18:37.166  
I was like, oh my God, I love to.

I would love to.

So we got back together  
and so we started building out our class.

It was a pure leadership class.

So we built the class  
and we talked about black history.

We talked about a lot of different issues  
that that they go through in their life.

And so we just start building upon that.

And so we came very close.

Well, when the time when it came time  
for us to get ready to go,

but they really wanted to go

So I got a next group of kids,  
the next group of kids.

It was about 15 of them. And

so I went to some of our,

0:19:32.958,0:19:35.958  
constituents here in Ogden.

And they wanted to know

0:19:38.000,0:19:42.083  
why we didn't go on the historic black  
college tour, because we had a fundraiser

0:19:42.083,0:19:46.250  
and everything, and I was like,  
we were \$15,000 short and they were like,

0:19:46.708,0:19:48.625  
Joseph Carey. I don't know if you know.

0:19:48.625,0:19:50.166  
Yup, state school board member.

0:19:50.166,0:19:53.166  
We met those kids down.

0:19:53.666,0:19:55.791  
I was like, yes, we broke -

0:19:55.791,0:20:00.208  
He said, Jamie,  
what are we going to do about this?

0:20:00.625,0:20:02.041  
This cannot happen.

0:20:02.041,0:20:05.375  
So anyway,  
the next thing I knew the following

0:20:05.375,0:20:09.041  
year, 2023, we start having a fundraiser.

0:20:09.041,0:20:10.625  
We start building up money.

0:20:10.625,0:20:11.666  
Everybody showed up.

0:20:11.666,0:20:14.750  
You showed up  
and the city council member showed up.

0:20:14.750,0:20:18.708  
The city showed up for these kids  
and we fed them.

0:20:18.708,0:20:20.625  
We had a soul food dinner.

0:20:20.625,0:20:21.500  
We did. We fit.

0:20:21.500,0:20:22.541  
We fed everybody.

0:20:22.541,0:20:26.958  
The program was okay, and we raised  
that money and we raised that money.

0:20:26.958,0:20:29.541  
And those kids, we were on that flight,

0:20:29.541,0:20:33.083  
and we were able to take those kids  
to the Washington, D.C.

0:20:33.083,0:20:36.208  
area on a historic black college  
tour and a history tour.

0:20:36.583,0:20:38.625  
So we did all that in five days.

0:20:38.625,0:20:41.625  
Those kids and some of them  
had never been out of Ogden,

0:20:42.000,0:20:45.250  
and it was 13 of them  
that had a beautiful experience

0:20:45.250,0:20:48.083  
seeing people that look like them.  
And we had all races.

0:20:48.083,0:20:52.708  
We had white, black, Hispanic,  
all those mixed of get mixture of kids

0:20:53.041,0:20:56.666  
that was able to just see how it is

0:20:56.666,0:21:01.375  
outside of Utah and different races and  
just the positivity of the whole thing.

It was incredible.  
And they will talk about that.

but now is going to play a huge role  
at the Marshal

Yes, I'm excited about that.

involved in participating.

That's the thing that your kids felt

didn't feel.

and to continue to struggle the way that they are

and our state.

they can't talk about in the classroom.

for the kids to come together.

some of the history.
